Charlotte-Mecklenburg Schools Expect to Cut Energy Costs By Half a Million Dollars

Piscataway, N.J., August 6, 2006 – When Charlotte-Mecklenburg (North Carolina) Schools was faced with an aging infrastructure and a shrinking budget, they understandably looked to reduce energy consumption and heating, ventilation and air conditioning (HVAC) system maintenance costs, without sacrificing indoor comfort.

With few solutions to be found, the school system decided to engage in a Performance Agreement for Comfort from Trane (PACT[™]). The 12-year contract, covering seven schools and 568 mobile classrooms, is projected to deliver more than \$550,000 in annual energy savings.

PACT consists of a package of products and services customized to specific building requirements and designed to deliver significant energy, water and operating cost reductions. The energy savings achieved through the new Charlotte-Mecklenburg Schools PACT are projected to pay for facility enhancements and renovations included in the contract.
